The Huntersville Police Department is investigating an Armed Robbery which occurred during the evening hours on February 13, 2018 in Huntersville, NC.

During an investigation that followed, Huntersville Police learned that several armed suspects entered an apartment located on Landings Drive in Huntersville, NC and assaulted and robbed the occupants. The suspects had bandanas partially covering their faces and two were armed with handguns. A third suspect was armed with an expandable baton. During the incident, a female victim was struck multiple times with the baton, punched and kicked in the face and head area, and later transported to the hospital for treatment. A male victim was robbed of US Currency and personal property at gunpoint. All suspects fled the scene on foot. Patrol officers circulated the area and located two possible suspects. These suspects were positively identified by one of the victims. These two suspects were transported back to the Huntersville Police Department where they were interviewed by detectives.

These two suspects were identified as Jamiel Micah Blackwell, B/M, 01-30-1997 of Mooresville, NC and Serbraun Marie Thompson, B/F, 09-30-1999 of Charlotte, NC.

Jamiel Micah Blackwell was charged with Breaking & Entering, Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon, Conspiracy to Commit Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon and Assault with a Deadly Weapon Inflicting Serious Injury.

Serbraun Marie Thompson was charged with Breaking & Entering, Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon, Conspiracy to Commit Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon and Assault with a Deadly Weapon Inflicting Serious Injury.



This is an active investigation and detectives are still looking for three persons of interest.
